Highlights From September




School Photos

New School Updates and Reminders

WhatsApp and Accurate Information

Most grades have a WhatsApp group that has been set up by the parents in that class. This is one way for parents to keep in touch with each other. When posting reminders about school activities, please ensure that information is accurate by double-checking the parent handbook, by reading the newsletters / teacher emails, or by checking with the class parent or the classroom teacher. Thank you for helping to keep everyone informed with accurate information.

Using the Drive Through Lane in the Parking Lot

When children require extra support getting out of or into the car, we ask parents to park in the designated area and escort their children. Parents should remain in their cars when they are using the drive through lane. This keeps the drive through lane moving efficiently so that cars do not back up on Williams Road. Staff members can help open curb-side car doors when needed in the drive through lane. Thank you for your cooperation.

New School Updates and Reminders

Parent Drivers

As sports away games and field trips are starting, here is an important reminder of our school policy regarding parent drivers: When parent drivers are used, teachers will assign students into cars. Parents may not organize which students they will drive, or which car their child will go in without prior teacher approval for special circumstances.

Early Morning Practices, After School Games, and Siblings

If your child has an early morning practice at school, please remember that you may not drop off their siblings at the same time, as supervision is not available. If your child has an after school practice or game, their siblings may only stay behind for games if their parent is also there watching, or, for older students, if they are performing an official function (such as scorekeeping).


Ongoing School Reminders

Parking Lot Routines

In the mornings and afternoons, parents may choose to park and escort their child to/from the front of the school or they may drop off/pick up their child using the drive-through lane (see map). Parents who escort their child to school must use the marked crosswalk. Please wait for the crossing guards to indicate that it is safe to cross.

The morning drop-off times are **8:25-8:45am**. Please do not drop off your child before 8:25am, as there is no supervision at that point.

The afternoon pick-up times are **2:50-3:05pm.**Outdoor supervision ends at 3:05pm.



Ongoing School Reminders

Criminal Record Checks (CRCs)

As part of our ongoing commitment to providing a safe environment for all students and community members, we require our parent volunteers to complete the following CRC check.

This includes roles that involve student interaction such as driving students to and from school events/games, any school day volunteering, coaching etc. You are strongly encouraged to complete this process now so if the opportunity arises for you to volunteer you will not be delayed or prevented from doing so. Please use the following link to complete this process and notify Laura Carandang from the parish that you have submitted your check. Results come directly to the parish.

As part of the criminal record check application, your identity will be verified electronically by the Ministry of Justice using your BC Services Card.

- 1) Log on to https://justice.gov.bc.ca/criminalrecordcheck/
- 2) Use our Access Code: G8HC368U38
- 3) Complete the on-line criminal record check application.
- 4) If your application is successfully submitted, you will get a confirmation service request number. Please email the service request number to Laura Carandang pa.stjw@rcav.org
- 5) The result will be emailed to us within 3-4 weeks, and you should receive a confirmation email. CRCs are valid for five years.

Student Absence Procedure

Thank you for following our new absence procedure this year. I have reprinted the procedure here as a reminder. If your child is absent from school:

- Email absent@stjosephtheworker.ca.
- "Cc" your child's classroom teacher so they are aware of the absence.
- Include your child's name and grade in the subject of your email.
- Include your child's name, the date of their absence, and the reason for their absence in the body of the email.
- An email is required for half-day absences if a student will be away for a full morning or afternoon.
